



What is SOTA?

- The purpose of SOTA is to encourage Amateur Radio based activity from the summits of hills and mountains in countries around the world and to provide an award system for Radio Amateurs in all DXCC Entities.
- Started in the UK in March 2002 and has been growing rapidly ever since.
- Similar to Islands on the Air (IOTA) but governed by its own set of rules and award system.




- Distinct geographical areas are organized by Associations
 - Each DXCC entity may form an Association
 - Large DXCC entities such as the US may be subdivided into separate Associations
 - Small DXCC entities may combine to form an Association

What to take – start with 10 essentials
